Dear Friends and Colleagues,

I am delighted to serve as the President of the Dominican Bar Association ("DBA"), an organization with which I have had great affinity and a long history as well.

While I am not clear who initially brought me and how I came across the group,
I do remember that I was studying for the NY State Bar at the time, that the group was called ASDA
(American Society of Dominican Attorneys) and that the person who insisted that I and everyone else joined and stayed was Victor Espinal.

Back then in the early 1990's, we met every Saturday. It is hard to imagine DBA meeting every week now, but then, not only were the meetings weekly, but they were pasa dias—all day long. We would start around midday with the Legal Workshops and Clinics at Intermediate School 143-La Placita, and would follow by chatting over a late Dominican lunch at the 184th street Caridad. Typically, the feast included the obligatory tostones, carne frita, concón con habichuela with morir soñando in the summer and sancocho in the winter. As long as the Dominican attorneys continued arriving, we kept ordering food and on occasions, we found ourselves ordering dinner as well. Like in the television show Cheers, everyone knew our names at Caridad, and we were known by our first names. Community members were so acquainted with our schedule that if they could not make it to the school, they would show up at the restaurant to ask their legal questions. I have such fond memories of that time, those places, that great food, but mostly of the people. Among them: Nilsa, Victor, sisters Tatica and Caridad, Jose, Many, Luis, Jose, Ada, the other Jose, Serapio, Pachy, whose real name we would later know to be Ebenezer Smith. I am glad I was part of this group that came to be the foundation of DBA.

Equally memorable were the Dominican-American attorneys with whom I fortunately shared what in retrospect was the structural phase of DBA in the late 1990's. There were Julia Rodriguez, Carmen Fernandez-Goldman, Millie Matos, Carmen Suardy, Ada Guillod, Manuel "Many" Mendez, among others. Unlike the initial group, the builders were aware of the transcendent nature of this phase of DBA and while we grew close, fun and extra curricular activities took a back seat to methodic work. DBA made tremendous inroads during these years. By the time this group left the leadership of DBA, the organization had been transformed in great part into what we currently know as DBA, with legal incorporation, by-laws, etc in place. It was this group which put DBA on the Bar associations' map, bringing it closer to par with other minority Bars.

I have not always been part of the DBA leadership; however, through my participation at meetings and events, I have kept a close watch on the progress of the Association and have become aware of the many attorneys who have helped to sustain it, to nurture it, to develop it. People like José Pérez, Andy Lugo, Luís Díaz, Julissa Gómez, Néstor Díaz, Many Tavares, Oscar Herasme, Faviola Soto, Elsa Marte-Hampton, Fiordaliza, Eliezard, Llenet Beltre, Manuel Mendez, again.

And here I am again as part of the leadership of DBA, this time as its President. And once again, I am among a decisive group of individuals, all leaders in their own right, who, like their predecessors, will live up to the challenges facing DBA. Challenges such as increasing visibility, increasing membership, assisting domestic and foreign attorneys, supporting law students, providing more pro-bono assistance to community members, and helping shape laws and policies. This year is an election year, when important legal and policy issues potentially impacting the Latino community hang in the balance: national defense, immigration reform, the economy, trade agreements, our civil liberties. As attorneys, we need to weigh in on these issues. We need to affirmatively support candidates at all levels of government who espouse laws and policies reflecting our values and interest, while conversely clearly reject those candidates who threaten to work against our values and interest.

As I now lead our beloved DBA, I obviously stand on the strong shoulders of all the folks who have arduously worked to make it what it is today. Fortunately for me and for DBA, I stand confidently ready to assume my role because I stand next to qualified, caring individuals, who like me, have DBA's best interest and that our community at heart. Leaders, who like me, are committed to serve DBA with the spirit of camaraderie that has reigned through all the phases of DBA.

I urge you to take this opportunity to join or renew your membership with DBA and join us in our commitment to continue our tradition of strength, growth and service.

Founded in New York City in 1990 as The American Society of Dominican Attorneys, DBA has grown to represent thousands of Latino attorneys and law students across the country. The DBA invites all Latino attorneys as well as others within the profession who subscribe to the goals and philosophy of DBA to become members.

Associate Justice Rolando T. Acosta

The Hon. Rolando T. Acosta, elected as a New York State Supreme Court Justice in New York County in 2002, was appointed in January 2008 by New York State Governor Elliot Spitzer to the Appellate Division, First Department. Prior to his election to the Supreme Court, Justice Acosta had been designated as an Acting Supreme Court Justice by Chief Judge Kaye to preside over, and spearhead the creation of, The Harlem Community Justice Center, a multi-jurisdictional, "problem-solving" court. Justice Acosta was elected to a County-wide Civil Court judgeship in New York County in 1997. He has published over one hundred decisions in the New York Law Journal, most of which have been published in the Official Reporter. Justice Acosta, immediate Past President of the Association of Judges of Hispanic Heritage was selected as the 2004 Judge of the Year by the National Hispanic Bar Association. He was recently awarded the 2008 John Carro Award for Judicial Excellence "in recognition of his leadership and scholarly work as a New York State Jurist and his work as a mentor and teacher within the Latino Community."

Justice Acosta is a 1979 graduate of Columbia College and a 1982 graduate of Columbia University School of Law. He is the recipient of Columbia University's "Medal for Excellence," conferred at the University's 2000 Commencement Exercises. In his Senior year at Columbia College, ten years after arriving as an immigrant from the Dominican Republic, Justice Acosta was named a Frank S. Hogan Scholar and was chosen by the student body to receive the Brainard Memorial Prize.

Prior to being elected to the Bench, Justice Acosta held various posts with the Legal Aid Society, including the Attorney-in-Charge of the largest civil trial office (1994-1995) and Director of Government and Community Relations, where he was responsible for developing the Society's legislative agenda and addressing government attacks on the Society and the poor. Justice Acosta served in Mayor (now Columbia Professor) David Dinkin's administration as the Human Rights Commission's Deputy Commissioner for Law Enforcement. In this role, he was responsible for directing all of the Commission's investigatory and prosecutorial functions, including the planning and execution of litigation strategy. In December 1993, Justice Acosta was appointed by Mayor Dinkins as a Commissioner of Human Rights.

Justice Acosta has been active in the development of the Washington Heights/Inwood social service infrastructuré. He helped found the Community Association of Progressive Dominicans and the Latino Commission on AIDS. He has also served as legal adviser to the founding board of Alianza Dominicana and as treasurer and Chair of the Policy Committee of the Hispanic Federation. He has been a member of Community Planning Board 12 and President of Community School Board 6. In

1995, he was appointed by Congressman Charles Rangel to serve as a founding board member of the Upper Manhattan Empowerment Zone (EZ). Until 1999, Justice Acosta served on the EZ's Executive Committee and chaired its Human Capital Development Committee, which he led in considering and recommending to the EZ Board all human capital and quality of life proposals.

Justice Acosta has been actively involved in numerous other community, civic, legal, and quasi-government organizations. He was commissioned by Chief Judge Kaye to serve on the Commission to Promote Public Confidence in Judicial Elections ("The Feerick Commission"). Until recently he served on the Continuing Legal Education Board (CLE) as a Chief Judge Kaye designee and currently serves on the Board of Advisors of the Louis Stein Center for Law and Ethics at Fordham Law School. Justice Acosta is a Fellow of the New York Bar Foundation and a former member of the New York American Inn of Court, created to improve the skills, professionalism and ethics of the bench and bar. He is a former President of the Association of Judges of Hispanic Heritage and member of the Board of the Juan Pablo Duarte Foundation.

Justice Acosta was the starting pitcher for the Columbia Lions and received every athletic prize awarded to a pitcher by the Ivy League and the Intercollegiate Baseball League during four years of varsity play, including First team All Ivy three times and Pitcher of the Year twice. In 1979, he was named one of the best student-athletes in the country by the NCAA, and, rather than play professional baseball, chose to attend Columbia Law School. A Dean's List student who still holds Columbia's season and career wins records, Justice Acosta was named to Columbia College Today's Dream Team in 1987. He has served as Board Member of the alumni associations of both the College and the Law School. He currently serves on the Advisory Board of Columbia's LAACU.

He resides in Northern Manhattan with his wife Vasthi and his children Zila and Lucas.

Jaime Mercado, Esq. is a Partner in the Firm's Corporate Department. He advises clients in mergers and acquisitions, corporate finance, and project finance transactions. Mr. Mercado is fluent in Spanish and Portuguese and concentrates primarily on transactions in the United States and Latin America.

In corporate finance, Mr. Mercado has recently participated in leading transactions in Latin America, including the \$1.3 billion debt offering by América Móvil S.A. de C.V. of Mexico, the largest debt offering by a Latin American corporate issuer at the time, as well as debt offerings by Celulosa Arauco y Constitución, the Chilean pulp manufacturer and by Caribbean Development Bank, a multilateral institution. Mr. Mercado also has represented issuers such as Diagnósticos da América, Distribución y Servicio D&S and Embotelladora Andina in their initial equity offerings, and represented the underwriters in the initial public offering by CPFL Energia of Brazil and in a secondary equity offering by Forest Oil Corporation, a U.S.-based oil exploration company. Mr. Mercado has represented Morgan Stanley, Citigroup, UBS, CSFB and JPMorgan, among others and has represented these and other underwriters in issuances of high-yield bonds by various U.S.-based issuers. Mr. Mercado also has participated in various issuances of debt by sovereign issuers, including representing the underwriters in inaugural and other bond offerings by the Dominican Republic and the Republic of Guatemala.

In project finance, Mr. Mercado has represented a sponsor group in connection with the privatization and financing of Sangster International Airport in Jamaica, the sponsors in the privatization and financing for the expansion of six international airports in the Dominican Republic, the developer of the largest tourism-related development in the Dominican Republic, and GE Capital in the development of various hydroelectric projects in Central America.

Mr. Mercado's recent liability management and debt restructuring transactions have included representation of EDENOR S.A., an Argentine electricity distribution company, in its partial cash tender offer structured as a modified Dutch auction and of Banco Hipotecario S.A. in the restructuring of all its outstanding bond and bank indebtedness. Mr. Mercado recently represented the dealer managers in connection with an exchange offer by Dominican Republic in its \$1.1 billion debt restructuring.

Mergers and acquisitions transactions in which Mr. Mercado has recently participated include representing the financial advisors in connection with the merger of shares (*incorporação de ações*) involving Companhia Siderúrgica Belgo-Mineira and Companhia Siderúrgica de Tubarão, Bavaria S.A. in its

acquisition of Backus and Johnston of Peru, CNET Networks Inc. in its acquisition of ZIFF-Davis Inc., and Owens-Illinois in its acquisition of Consumer Products Inc. of Canada. Mr. Mercado also has experience in private equity transactions, including representing The Blackstone Group in various investments in Mexico and Argentina and the Brait Group in South Africa, in addition to representation of targets of private equity investments, most recently Promotora Ambiental S.A. in Mexico.

Mr. Mercado is active in pro bono activities at the Firm. He heads the Legal Aid Society's Associates' Campaign for the Firm and helps coordinate various activities for New York Cares, a charitable organization dedicated to improving the lives of all New Yorkers. In addition, Mr. Mercado serves on the boards of several public interest organizations, including Alianza Dominicana and Good Shepherd Volunteers.

Mr. Mercado received his B.A. in 1989 from Columbia University and his J.D. in 1995 from New York University School of Law.

Josefa Sicard-Mirabal serves as Director of Arbitration and ADR in North America for ICC's International Court of Arbitration. In this capacity, she represents and promotes ICC dispute resolution services in the United States and Canada, and advises North American attorneys and companies on all phases of arbitration, including negotiation of arbitration clauses, requests for arbitration, procedural issues and enforcement of arbitration awards.

Ms. Sicard-Mirabal began her legal career in the Dominican Republic, first as a judge in a small claims court and subsequently as chief justice of the Civil, Commercial and Labor Court. Since 1989, she has been in private practice in the United States, serving as Of Counsel in the New York office of Winston & Strawn and in the Miami office of Greenberg Traurig, and as an associate at the New York office of Thelen Reid and Priest.

Raised and educated in New York City, Ms. Sicard-Mirabal moved to the Dominican Republic and received a law degree from the Pontificia Universidad Católica Madre y Maestra. She continued her legal studies at Fordham University School of Law in New York. She is admitted to the New York State bar and the Dominican Republic bar. She is fluent in English, French, and Spanish.

Ms. Sicard-Mirabal founded and chairs Dominicans on Wall Street, Inc., a non-profit organization created primarily to serve as a liaison between Dominican companies seeking access to the U.S. and international capital markets and American companies wishing to invest in the Dominican Republic. She has been named one of the "20 Leading Latinas in Business" by Hispanic Enterprise magazine, in its September 2007 issue, one of the "100 Most Influential Hispanics" by Hispanic Business Magazine in its October 2006 issue, and was a 2006 recipient of the DTM Magazine Latino Trendsetters Award.

RAMONA EMILIA ROMERO

Ramona Romero is Corporate Counsel, Logistics and Energy at DuPont, where she is currently responsible for legal oversight of the acquisition of transportation, distribution, supply chain management and energy resources totaling billions of dollars each year. Previously, Ramona managed all facets of DuPont Legal's industry-leading outside counsel and supplier partnering program and oversaw many departmental operations, including e-discovery and litigation reporting for compliance with Sarbanes-Oxley. Having spent most of her career as a litigator, Ramona has also managed complex commercial and antitrust cases for DuPont. Prior to joining the Company, she practiced at a large firm in Washington, DC.

Ramona is known nationally as an advocate for diversity in the legal profession and as an expert in law department operations and outside counsel management. She has spoken at dozens of conferences and has been featured or quoted in numerous publications, including *The New York Times, Metropolitan Corporate Counsel* and *Corporate Counsel Magazine*, among others. Throughout her career, Ramona has been a volunteer leader in many community and professional organizations, including the American Red Cross in the Delmarva Peninsula and Delaware Futures (a support program for talented at-risk high school students). She has also served as President of the Hispanic Bar Association of the District of Columbia and is a co-founder of the Dominican American National Roundtable, the first effort to empower Dominican-Americans nationally. Currently, she is the President-Elect of the Hispanic National Bar Association and will become its National President in September 2008.

Ramona's leadership and contributions have been recognized in a variety of contexts. For example, in 2007 she received the Lucero Award ("lucero" is Spanish for guiding star) from the Puerto Rican Legal Defense and Education Fund. Also in 2007, *Hispanic Business Magazine* identified her as one of the 100 most influential Hispanics in the United States.

Ramona earned her BA from Barnard College, Columbia University in 1985 and her J.D. from Harvard Law School in 1988. She is a member of the Hispanic National Bar Association, the Cuban American Bar Association, the Dominican Bar Association, the Hispanic Bár Association of Pennsylvania, the Association of Corporate Counsel, the Association of Transportation Law Professionals, and the American Bar Association. Ramora is admitted in Pennsylvania, the District of Columbia (inactive) and Delaware (as in-house counsel).
